a. Attendance Policy – HPSD Administrative Procedure (AP) 330

A new attendance officer has been hired by HPSD. This person will be able to identify factors that lead to missing attendance for students. This is a new position that will aid the staff with attendance issues.

Admin staff members are happy to have a clear process on attendance and the procedures around it. The policy has a progressive approach on the policies around attendance.

<u>Family Commitment Statement:</u> There have been non productive interactions between the school staff members and the family members of students. This will create procedures to enable proper productive communication between staff members and family members and if that is not attainable it will move on to the school division. The policies also outline ways in which staff can rebuild the relationships between the families and the staff/schools. This statement has greatly clarified the processes and ability to open dialogue and have different levels of staff members be on the same page to work together.
