 - a. Routhier Principal Report: What's new at Routhier

~We received the DELF certificates from last year. They were presented to the students. All students who took part in the exam were successful.

~We had the Terry Fox walk - Gr. 4,5,6 walked around town for an hour with a fire truck escort. Gr. 1,2,3 walked around the school yard for 20-30 min. The committee set a goal to raise \$500 and were able to surpass their goal and raised over \$1239.55. Students were encouraged to wear the color red and identify an individual that they were walking for. Student's watched a video and learned about Terry Fox and his message of hope.

~We had numerous activities planned throughout the week for orange shirt day. Students read many different stories, created artwork and wrote messages of love to residential survivors. The flag was lowered to half mass to show support and recognition of the children who never came home from residential schools. Students were encouraged to wear the color orange on the 30th to show support and awareness.

~Students were chosen to take part in our school recycling program and fruit bins. Students had to apply for the position and were interviewed individually in order to get the job.

~Students were chosen to help create our school's radio advertisement this month. Each month different students will be asked to read the radio announcements for our school.

~Our school has been randomly chosen to fulfill an OHS audit of Covid protocols. We will be answering questions while walking through the routines and procedures that have been put in place to limit the spread of covid in our school.

~School picture day will be on the 13th.

~We would like to welcome Jenny Varaat as a puff EA for play school.

~We are still looking to hire a cook, but have not been successful in finding a candidate for the job.

Wellness-Pam/Carolyn

-PACE-Community Support, Sexual Assault and Trauma Centre spoke to all grades on the topics of : Sexual Abuse, Sexual Assault and Sexual Harassment.

Day 1

- Define sexual abuse, assault, and harassment
- Discuss that sexual violence is never the victim's fault
- Brainstorm what to do if someone experienced sexual violence and how to help a friend who experienced it. Also reinforce the importance of telling an adult

Day 2

- Covered sexting
- Brainstorm how to cope with having experienced sexual violence

Talk about consent (Asking for a “yes”) and debunk the myths surrounding sexual violence.

- Discuss indicators of healthy and unhealthy relationships
- Cover issues with Pornography in society
- Discuss why people sexually offend, including unhealthy ideas of masculinity, women, and sex.
- What individuals and society can do to help reduce or eliminate sexual violence in our communities.

-Nutrition Program is up and running with Ms. Chelsea and Mrs. Colter overseeing-We are collaborating with Jr. High Wellness classes for preparing and planning.
