COSC April 5th meeting, ASCA resolutions discussed, mental health proposal presented. Brought to present tonight but will hold for June when more people here. Done presenting mental health proposal and rural sustainability to all municipalities. Lots of support. April 9/10 strategic planning and budget. –set goals and visions for the upcoming school year. Mental health is in top 3 (moreover, wellness and wellbeing). Focus on more community involvement within the schools. See the need to connect with the resources and people of the community. Duo stream is important and expensive. Would benefit from building within the community –francophone spirit.

Alyssa and Tara attended. David Irvine –great speaker. Gave a message about empathy and seeking to understand before reacting. Understanding relationships and people's needs. Transformational relationships, rather than transitional relationships. 'Snowplow' parents = clearing the road to make it easier for the kids rather than allowing the kids to work through the obstacles.

Curriculum sessions –could have had more useful information. One session did seem to be exciting which was nice to see. Up to interpretation may work in different ways depending on the school and situation.

Guide to Education will not change and that is what teachers are expected to follow? –hours and percentages of day. Example 30min of physical activity.

How are the staff feeling?? Slowly getting into it. Meetings are ongoing.

Maybe they haven't had enough time to let it sink in. Not imminent –just trying to get through the day and rest of the year for now.

Some teachers have been told every year since 2012 that the curriculum would change and it hasn't changed yet. So some may not believe it will change.

Worried for well-being of Educators due to the short time to prepare for the new roll out of the curriculum.
