c. Trustee Report

- We will be continuing to hold Community Consultations discussing such topics as cell phone use policy, report cards, attendance and homework. ERS and GPV have been completed and we are grateful for the feedback provided by the participants.

- Student Advisory Groups sessions are being set up. ERS and GPV is set for February 19/25. This will help provide to the Board student feedback to also help guide our strategic planning session this year, much like the community consultations.
- At December's Board meeting, the Board of Trustees voted to support the
 expansion of our green certificate offering and will be starting on the
 installation of a hydroponics farm that will specialize in the growing of
 strawberries, lettuce, and other vegetables. It is our hope that the program
 will be able to sell to local grocery stores as they devoted a lot of time and
 money into making sure that this project will succeed.
- In addition to this, HPSD is looking at how we can redesign our High School Knowledge & Employability courses to better accommodate students and the complexities in their timetable and programming. We anticipate being able to offer work skills and job entry skills programming for K&E that will engage them further within their studies as well as building positive relationships through work placements with different businesses in the community.
- In academics, as a Division, we have moved to the digital writing of exams (PAT's and Dips). We are working towards embracing the writing of these

exams with VRETTA. Now, while there were initially some problems with the process that we had to work out, our students and staff preserved and our entire division now writes these assessments online. There has been some growing pains with roll over to online examinations, however we believe that the students are stepping up to the challenge.

 Lake. They asked to partner with the school division to start a para sport program in the community.

<u>Update from Minister of Education on Transportation</u>

Effective September 1, 2025, due to resource and capacity concerns, Alberta Education has implemented a change to the Student Transportation Regulation. In March of 2023, Alberta's government amended the regulation to change the distance criteria from 2.4 kilometres for all students to 1 kilometre for Grades 1 to 6 students and 2 kilometres for Grades 7 to 12 students. These changes were to come into effect on September 1, 2025. Because we knew this was coming, HPSD decided to implement the change right away. Since then, the Alberta government has heard feedback from school authority partners that the revised criteria could pose resource and capacity concerns. In response to those concerns, Alberta's government has decided to change the distance criteria for Grades 1 to 6 students to 1.6 kilometres instead of 1 kilometre, effective September 1, 2025. The criteria for Grades 7 to 12 students will remain unchanged at 2 kilometres. We don't know, at this time, how this change will affect our division.

9. New Business

a. GPV Attendance Policy & HPSD Attendance Policy – Administrative Procedure AP 330 – Student Attendance

HPSD passed this in the fall. Vanier built their own policies to support this and it is in the draft stage. This will be applied in the second

semester. It takes a more solution based approach to aid parents and students to solve problems and get to the root of the problem.

b. HPSD Graduation Administration Procedure (AP 375) – Requirement to Participate in Graduation Ceremonies

Passed in late fall and was fully implemented in December. This holds students to a standard and outlines specific details. Legacy hours for Vanier expectations are not outlined in this document as that is unique to Vanier School.
