- Presentation from Coordinator of Planning & Special Projects, Brennan MacDonald:
 - Collegiate Application
 - Hoping to be successful recipients sometime in March/25
 - Will be approximately a \$3M project
 - Focus on trades, healthcare and business services, with eventual expansion into education.
 - Goal to increase PS exposure by offering more Dual Credit options and micro-credential support classes.
 - Micro-credentials (which also leads to 'badging')
 - Designed for college prep or the job market
 - Short, work-at-your-own-pace courses used to pad resumes
 - Wide range of interests
 - Can lead to University Transfer Courses
 - K&E courses will also be supported through Portage College (Math/LA
 - Looking into building courses specific to student needs or desires
 - Nutrition
 - Lunch Programs are occurring at all schools in HPSD except three
 - Working to get a lunch program for the remaining schools there is an ad out to get a cook at ERS
 - There are snack programs at every school we are currently on the wait list for the Breakfast Club of Canada for the entire division
 - Professional Development is now available for Cooks
 - Traditional meals will be offered/served first at Prairie River Junior High School and will expand to other schools
 - HPSD partnered with the High Prairie food bank this past summer to provide snacks for kids.
 - Farming Project 3 Stages
 - Stage 1 Urban Gardening through Living Walls

- Tied to science curriculum for grades 1-12, this program will introduce & reinforce the gardening cycle to students
- Will be introduced in Lakeside Outreach, Roland Michener, Joussard, High Prairie Elementary, Prairie River Junior High,
 & Georges P Vanier
- This program will be funded through grants & local business donations
- Stage 2 Rural Gardening
 - Hydroponic farms up to 2 acres
 - Sell the vegetables/fruit to local businesses including Boondocks, IGA, Co-op etc.
 - This program would be supported through Options, Finance & Agriculture classes
- Stage 3 Ranching
 - Looking to raise livestock in or near towns
 - May be partnering with the Ag Society to house the animals at their facility

Bussing Routes Update

There is still one route (in the West End) not operational. There are currently two drivers being trained to potentially fill in the gaps. This situation is being worked on.

Numeracy Framework Update

Committee will meet one more time in December. Soft rollout - February/March 2025. Both frameworks (literacy & numeracy) will be in place for the beginning of the next school year.

Mental Health Services Proposal Update

A response letter has been received from the Minister of Mental Health & Addiction regarding our mental health services proposal. Recovery Alberta, the new health agency responsible for the delivery and oversight of mental health and addiction care in Alberta, has let us know that they are interested in partnering with HPSD to support enhanced psychiatric care for children and youth in the HPSD area which is a very positive step. We have the opportunity to work with Recovery Alberta on creating a process to review complex cases with parents, child and school-based providers and a collaborative referral and support processes.

• We met with the President & the CEO of the Public School Boards Association on October 30, 2024 to discuss following issues:

- o Funding Weighted Moving Average We discussed the fact that, although this funding model seems to help the school boards that have a decline in student population, this funding model does not meet the needs of our school division. This funding model is still based on the number of registered students in a count that is made on September 30, 2024. Because our student numbers are declining, we still must pay for the rising costs of maintaining the same size schools. So our funding is steadily going down while our costs are going up.
- o Mental Health Services We discussed our mental health services proposal.
- o Portable Classroom builds advocating for the possibility of having local builders build the much-needed portable classrooms in some areas: first, to have them built in a timely manner and second, to stimulate the local economy in these areas.
- Infrastructure Funding We discussed the declining and inadequate funding to maintain aging schools.
- o Attraction & Retention of Teachers & Professionals in rural areas because our province is growing tremendously, the

Alberta Government has introduced a capital project to build 30 new schools in 3 years. These schools will require a huge amount of staff therefore increasing the possibility of making it even harder for rural school boards to attract and retain these required teachers & professionals.
