### **School Council Notes – March 11, 2025**

Presentation from Harold Johnson and Stacy Plesuk from Big Lakes Child Care Society (new society being started up) regarding their possible purchase of the existing Daycare, continued lease of such, and support from the Division.

Presentation from our Director of Transportation, Sheldon Bossert.

- Red Light Violations/Media and RCMP Awareness
  - 13 East end, 3 West end, 4 Central – visible, captured and sent to RCMP (since September)
  - Hot Zones: SL Holiday Inn area, SL HWY 2, Central HWY 2 just west of Enilda
  - 11 in town, 1 school violation, 8 on secondary and primary HWY's (reportable)
  - Non-reportable – 30 (potentially higher)
  - Total of 50 = ratio of 1 incident every 2 school days
  - Public Education: STAA (Student Transportation Association of Alberta) recently wrote a letter to the Minister of Transportation for awareness campaign – Minister has put it back to school divisions to create such a campaign
    - Extendable 6 foot stop arm added to 1 of our buses (SL Holiday Inn bus 205) as a pilot project – extremely popular Facebook post (245 reactions/comments, 29 shares, over 9000 video views)
    - Local media sharing
    - All 3 RCMP detachments have been contacted with statistics from HPSD and asked to increase patrol time in school areas and “flyby hotspots”
  - Bus idling times for Winter 24/25
    - Dec 1/23-Jan 27/24 – 2185 idling hours – 13,495 L of fuel
    - Dec 1/24-Jan 27/25 – 1972 idling hours – 12,356 L of fuel
    - Since Motive idling down 9.7% and fuel consumption down 8.4%
    - More than \$26,000 savings in this 2 month span
  - 25/26 changes to school bus funding
    - K-6 @ 1.6 km, 7-12 @ 2.0 km – projected changes
    - Funding impact
  - Bus Rodeo – May 31, 2025 – 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.
    - First year back will be a bit scaled down

- 4-5 events of: Written exam, Offset Alley, Straight Line, Diminishing Clearance, Back up Test, Right Turn Test, Curb Line Event...
- New salad bars at RMSS and GPV, similar to EWP's. Money comes from the Nutrition Grants
- Congrats to David Miller of LSO going to AB Skills Competition for Culinary Arts
- GPV trip to Costa Rica – March 21 – April 1, 2025 approved in full
- The holiday days for the 2025-26 school year calendar were approved at the February board meeting. The final school year calendar for the 2025-26 school year will be discussed and approved at the March board meeting.
- ASCA is having a half-day spring symposium rather than a conference this year, on Saturday, April 26. The AGM will take place on Sunday, April 27. Both are virtual events. Registration on the website – deadline April 14, 2025.
- Trustee, Karin Scholl & Trustee, Adrian Wong conducted Student Engagement sessions with Grade 2 students at ERS & Grade 8 students at GPV. Student engagement sessions were also conducted in Slave Lake with the same two classes. Multiple questions were asked and the responses were documented using AI technology. Student voice is important in aiding us with strategic planning.
- We will be discussing the 2025 ASCA resolutions at our next Board meeting on March 18, 2025.
- This weekend, we will be having our Strategic Planning session to revise/set goals and priorities for the next year school budget. We will be consulting all the data that we have received during all of the public engagement sessions (including the student engagement sessions).
- High Prairie School Division is hosting our summer school virtually this July for all Grade 10-12 students, offering a variety of courses. The summer school will run online from July 2 – 31. Registration for all courses will be open until Friday, April 17. After that deadline, only courses with sufficient enrolment will continue to take registrations. Courses are being offered in a condensed format. Students may register for one 4-week course in our 2025 summer school. - Ben Bella - Minister's Youth Advisory Council - Delegation
  - Grade 10 student at Roland Michener
  - Group of 40 students from across Alberta, aged 14 to 18
  - Selected to provide insight and advice on Alberta's education system
  - Council is run by Alberta Education & Alberta's Minister of Education, Demetrios Nicolaides
  - The Council meets three times each school year, either in Edmonton or virtually, to discuss important topics in education.
  - Application process was extensive – out of over 200 applicants, he was among the 80 invited for a video interview with the Council staff. He was selected as one of 40 students to join the Council.
  - He worked with a group of five other Council members on rural education
- Diploma Exams
  - Due to the inclement weather, there were bus cancellations for three days. Only 1 student missed 1 diploma exam.
- Calendar survey has launched. Over 500 responses received to date
- Alberta assurance surveys should be out already. They should be sent in the mail. Access codes will be received for all parents of Grade 4, 7 & 10. Random Access codes will now be provided to the schools again which is great.
- Director of Facilities - Butch Gagnon
  - Utility costs keep climbing. Technology upgrades - PA systems obsolete. Will be updating all PA systems. Fire alarm systems are being upgraded in all schools as they are obsolete as well. Building maintenance systems are being replaced in schools. Phone systems are being upgraded in all schools. Video cameras are all done & upgraded.
  - Insurance & safety requirements continue to be a huge demand on building maintenance thereby increasing costs. For example, sidewalk replacements, PA systems, video security systems, playground equipment etc. Preventative maintenance inspections are also requirements for insurance & safety.
  - Buzzer systems replacements/upgrading are complete.
  - Carpets are being removed at all schools which will save in contractor costs for carpet cleaning. The division will be carpet free very soon.
  - IMR funding has increased from 674715 - 968929 which will all be going to roofing.

- Instead of portables, we need Mini Mods.
- Manpower - new electrician hired to replace previous electrician. The contract for the janitors will be tendered out this year.
