Grade 9 presentation: visited the grade 9 classes to start conversations about post high school planning in preparation for ELAA.

## 9. New Business

### a. Superintendent Message

Thank you to the parents who have come out to be on the school councils. It is an advisory role to the school and school board and much needed from the community. ASCA (Alberta School Councils Association) bring information to the trustees and then trustees can take to the government. Your voice is very important and it is a great way to get your voice heard.

The school council must submit a report at the end of the year.

The school council must submit a detailed financial summary. We ask that fund raising take a secondary role and that advising the school of the voice of parents and community be a priority.

School councils cannot get licensing to fundraise and cannot accept money raised from gaming.

The ASCA conference is at the end of April. Not sure what will happen with conference this year as ASCA has lost most of its funding. Each school council will receive \$500 grant.

As well, each school council will receive \$150 once executive has been elected and submitted.

The Alberta government will pay for two members from each school council to attend conference. And will pay \$350 in addition for PD –can be used for travel to conference. Sue is the go to for this if need help.

The ASCA –forum with all the potential new premiers.

Can have workshops to bring parents in.

All school councils spend their \$500 then they would top up to 600,000 budget.

### c. Fees pilot project:

Vanier: Right now have fees for a few items –example foods class. This year we will pilot removing those fees. Budget has been reviewed and it looks like will not be affected by this removal. Removes a barrier from parents. Goal for the future is to also remove fees for school sports. So many aspects of being on a team that provides benefit to the students and family. Especially students at risk –and many of these students are unable to pay. Busing is the largest part of the fee unfortunately.

Routhier: Fee schedule –fundraisers each year and the funds generated go towards things such as field trips, swimming.

- d. International Travel –Vanier. Need approval from the school board. Discussed a national trip first because it has been a while since leaving the country. Not sure will get approved to leave the country. Passport is also a concern as timeline for a passport is 6 months. ?Quebec in March/April 2024. Fundraising takes about 18months. Quebec is only open to FLA students. It is used as an incentive for French Language Arts Students. Pattern of travel has been Quebec to FLA students and International travel to all students.
- e. Routhier Food Program?: A lot of kids are coming to school hungry...solutions...Need a cook and a wellness coach for this program to succeed. Now very close to having a cook and the wellness coach will start in October. Lunch will be a paid program. The Fruit in the morning and throughout the day will be a free option always available to students. The division provides apples, pulms and pears. Could Routhier have a breakfast program? –would take funding and volunteers. Could possibly add granola bars to fruit bins in the classes. Need funding for the extra food in the fruit bins.
- f. Joe Media is coming back to the area –will be at Ecole Hertitage will be hosting, open to all community members October 3 at 7pm.
- g. Routhier and Vanier have received funding from OLIF which will help pay for French cultural programing during school council. Will be offering free French programing to anyone during the school council meetings, instead of babysitting.
- h. Online ASCA website Anxiety workshop tomorrow and lots of other workshops offered online through the ASCA website. Worth looking at.
- i. National Truth and Reconciliation Day on September 30, 2022. There is also a link to an indigenous scholarship that is available to apply for.
